

The purpose of the Rules is to provide the Club with some means to control the assignment of facilities to the members, and to govern Club affairs for the benefit of all the members. Since written rules cannot cover every circumstance, consideration for other members and common sense observation of the spirit of the rules is essential. The TSCC House Rules have been taken from the current by-laws of the Toronto Sailing and Canoe Club.

TSCC House Rules 2006

- 1) The Clubhouse is for the exclusive use of the members and their guests. All other persons will not be admitted except in the company of a member.
- 2) Members must be properly attired at all times. Shirts/tanktops and sandals/shoes must be worn. Bathing suits are not acceptable in the Club House. Suitable attire must be worn in the lounges, dining area and grounds. Wet gear and clothing are not to be worn in the lounge area. 'Proper attire' does not apply when a dragon boat member is coming to or from the change room for a dragon boat practice session.
- 3) Sailing/canoe gear and clothing is not to be left in the lounge.
- 4) Cars are not allowed on Club property with the exception of local service and deliveries, bringing in a boat and Club trailers. All cars must park in the city parking lot. The main gate is to be kept closed at all times.
- 5) Members are requested to maintain tidiness in the shower rooms, lounges and Club property which is essential to good housekeeping. Club dishes, glasses and cutlery taken outside must be returned to the grill area.
- 6) The Club is not responsible for any loss or damage to members' personal property or equipment
- 7) Dogs are not allowed in the Clubhouse as per Ontario Board of Health regulations. Any dogs brought onto the Club property must be kept on a leash.
- 8) Security codes for Club access are given out by the Rear-Commodore. There is a separate code for the main gate, Club entrance and the Vanguard shed. Access codes are not to be given out to non-members.

- 9) Club security is the responsibility of all members. The last member leaving the Clubhouse, Vanguard Shed or Club property must check that the windows, doors and gate are securely closed.

Appropriate Use of the Patio and Clubhouse:

- 1) The patio and the Clubhouse interior are not to be used for dry land training or as an exercise/warm-up area.

- 3) For scheduled meetings of up to 30 people (who are TSCC members) there is no charge for use of the Clubhouse for a meeting. However, to prevent scheduling conflicts, the General Manager or a member of the staff must be notified of the proposed meeting date.
- 4) For meetings which are greater than 30 people and involve non-Club members the room must be booked and will be properly staffed by TSCC. Bookings are done through the Vice Commodore or General Manager. There will be a discounted charge for the room.
- 5) If a team wishes to use the BBQ's, the General Manager needs to be notified. There is generally no charge for use of the BBQ's. The Club needs to make sure that use of the Clubhouse and/or BBQ's is not double booked. If any propane tanks are empty, please let the Club staff know.

Bar Area

- 1) If a group wishes to make early morning coffee after a practice, the coffee machine behind the bar is available for use. If not familiar with its operation please ask the staff. The bar area must be left clean; any spillages must be cleaned up.
- 2) If a group brings in muffins and the like, any waste food must be put into the main bin outside on the east side of the Clubhouse, not the containers inside or on the patio. This is an Ontario Board of Health regulation.
- 3) Only TSCC bar staff is allowed behind the bar during hours of TSCC operation. This is an Alcohol and Gaming Commission regulation.

Alcohol

All members are reminded that the use of alcoholic beverages on the premises is governed by the Club license as issued by the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario. Non-licensed alcohol cannot be brought onto the licensed area of TSCC at anytime, 24/7 as per AGCO regulations.
